Each parish sponsored family is required to earn \$175 in SCRIP profit. 75% of earnings above the goal will be applied toward the next year's tuition. Families who do not re-enroll will receive a tuition rebate check.

**DEDUCT \$250** from the above figure if your family did not have a child in OCS during 2009-2010. If applying for financial assistance, please check the appropriate box in Section C of the PSAS Student Aid Form.

- Owensboro Catholic Schools utilize a need-based tuition assistance system shifting parish subsidy dollars out of the general fund and endowment earnings into a tuition assistance fund allowing us to provide \$860,000 in tuition assistance to our families.
- Owensboro Catholic Schools encourage all families to apply for financial aid. More than half of families applied and received financial assistance for the 2010-2011 school year.
- The Private School Aid Service (PSAS) Student Aid process will determine how the tuition assistance dollars will be awarded.
- The PSAS Student Aid Form is easy to complete. However, if you need assistance, please contact the Central Office at 686-8896.

- Forms mailed by February 15, 2010 will participate in the initial aid pool, **where the majority of tuition assistance will be awarded.**
- Less tuition assistance may be available for forms filed after February 15, 2010.
- **All aid will be awarded by August 1, 2010.**
  - After August 1, 2010, only appeals for extraordinary circumstances will be accepted.
  - New families registering throughout the course of the school year will have the opportunity to file for financial assistance.

## SCRIP SUCCE\$\$ Tuition Rebate Program

SCRIP is a term that means 'substitute money.' When you purchase SCRIP, you are purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use SCRIP to purchase everyday items such as food, clothing, and other essentials. With every purchase you earn revenue for our schools and a tuition rebate.

Each Parish-Sponsored family agrees to generate at least \$175 in profit through the SCRIP SUCCE\$\$ program during the year, or to buy out of the SCRIP program by paying this amount. This profit or buy out is in addition to the tuition rates. At the end of the year, families who have not reached the \$175 goal will be billed for the difference. Once you have met your goal, 75% of every profit dollar is earned back by you as a tuition rebate. The SCRIP SUCCE\$\$ tuition rebate earned cannot exceed the total family tuition amount.

Participation in SCRIP is easy. Inventory is kept on hand at our office so most SCRIP orders can be filled the same day. When school is in session, you can fill out an order form and send it along with your payment to school with your child. We will pick up orders, fill them and return them to your child on the same day.

The SCRIP year for the 2010-2011 school year begins June 1, 2010 and ends May 31, 2011. The SCRIP SUCCE\$\$ Office is located at 1524 W. Parrish Ave., at the rear of Owensboro Catholic High School. The SCRIP Office is open Monday through Friday 8 am - 5 pm during the school year. During the summer months, the SCRIP Office is open Monday through Friday 10 am - 5 pm.
